ANCESTOR'S SERVICE

"Section 1. Any man shall be eligible to membership in the Society who, being of the age of eighteen years or over, and a citizen of good repute in the community, is the legal descendant of an ancestor who was at all times entitled to his liberty in, and rendered active service in, the cause of American Independence, either as an officer, soldier, seaman, mariner, militiaman, or private man, in the armed forces of the Continental Congress, or of any one of the several Colonies or States, or as a signer of the Declaration of Independence, or as a member of a Committee of Safety or Correspondence, or as a member of any Continental, Provincial, or Colonial Congress or Legislature, or as a recognized person who performed actual service by direct acts of resistance to the authority of Great Britain."—Constitution of Son of the American Revolution, A. R., Article III, Section 1, adopted June 2, 1907, and as amended.

Membership is based upon one original claim; when the applicant desires eligibility by descent from more than one ancestor, and it is desired to make advantage thereof, separate applications, to be marked "Supplemental Application," should be made in each case and filed with the original.

Please fully and accurately state the following in each case, and also the residence of ancestor, with date of birth and death, if known.

By order of the Board of Trustees, May 3, 1911, the recipient of a certificate granted on this application agrees to surrender his certificate upon failure to pay his membership fee, unless his membership shall cease by reason of death or actual disability, to be determined by the Society of which he is a member.

My ancestor's services in assisting in the establishment of American Independence during the War of the Revolution were as follows:

FOSTER, Timo W., Captain, 1st Co., 3d Lt. 800th Co. regt. of Mass. militia; list of
officers and men present company as in said regiment, attached by Joseph Fox to
field officer; ordered in Council Aug. 23, 1774 that said officers be commissioned;
reported commissioned July 25, 1774; also, Captain, Major William L. Brock
detachment of militia; engaged Sept. 1, 1777; discharged Nov. 1, 1779; service
2 mo. 2 days, defending frontier of Lincoln Co.
Captain Timothy Foster removed from Ashboro, Mass. to Winthrop, Maine in 1784;
was the first settler; selected as constable, captain in the militia, an active
leader, his eight sons served in the Revolutionary War.

FOSTER, Timothy (Jr.) Private, Capt. John Blum's Co., Col. Samuel McComb's regt.;
service between June 24, 1779, and September 28, 1779. 1 mo. on Penobscot expedition.
